We launch a pilot of the Court Appointed Friend and Advocate (CAFA) Mentor Program.



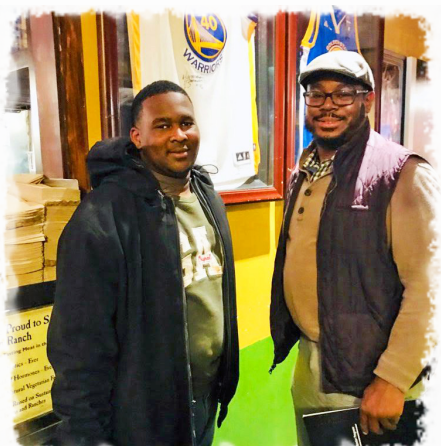
2015
